

Instructions for Hardrock No Rinse Neutral Marble Cleaner NC7893

This product is a concentrated cleaner with special dirt and grease cutting additives for frequent mopping of natural, polished stone floors and for scrubbing counter tops, showers, walls, tubs, and other upper stone surfaces.

DIRECTIONS FOR FLOORS

1. Dust mop, sweep, or vacuum the floor to remove any loose dirt that may be present.
2. For normal cleaning mix 1 part **Hardrock Cleaner** 40 parts warm water. (Approximately 3.2oz per gallon of water).
NOTE: To avoid "foaming" be sure to put the water in the container first and add the cleaner to the water.
3. Damp mop the floor with a clean mop set aside for use only on your stone floor.
4. Allow the floor to dry completely before allowing any foot traffic. If water streaks occur, simply buff them off with a soft cloth or white buffing pad.
5. Since **Hardrock Cleaner** is a neutral cleaner you may mop as often as needed. We suggest mopping at least once per week.

DIRECTIONS FOR UPPER SURFACES

1. Mix **Hardrock Cleaner** with water using the same instructions as floors above.
2. Pour into a spray bottle and spray on to the surface or apply with a sponge or soft cloth and scrub vigorously. Wipe dry with a clean, soft cloth.

SAMPLE TESTING: Before using, always test each surface to be treated in a small inconspicuous area to insure the desired results will be achieved. Consult supplier for further information and precautions, including Material Safety Data Sheets.

CAUTION: Contains 2-butoxyethanol and Isopropyl Alcohol. Use only in well ventilated areas. Avoid breathing of vapor or prolonged or repeated contact with skin. Keep away from eyes.

FIRST AID

Skin: Wash with soap and water. If irritation persists, call physician.

Eyes: Flush with water for 15 minutes. Call physician.

Ingestion: Give 1 or 2 glasses of water. Call a physician immediately.

Inhalation: Get person to fresh air. If unconscious, call physician. Container Disposal: Rinse three times with water.

Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill (dump), or by incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay away from smoke.
