

Instructions for Hardrock Penetrating Sealer PS1000

HARDROCK PENETRATING SEALER is a clear, penetrating sealer with special formula of polymerized silicone designed to provide a long-term protection from stains.

COVERAGE: Up to 4000 square feet depending on the surface.

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIAL:

1. Sponge, Sprayer
2. Cloth, Towel
3. Easy Mask or Surface Mask Tape, or Pre-Taped Drop Cloth.

SAMPLE TESTING: Before using, always test each surface to be treated in a small inconspicuous area to insure the desired results will be achieved. Consult supplier for further information and precautions, including Material Safety Data Sheets.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Protect adjoining surfaces such as carpeting with Easy Mask or Surface Mask Tape, or Pre-Taped Drop Cloth.
2. Clean the surface to be treated with appropriate Hardrock Cleaner or Stripper.
3. Apply enough solution to wet surface, let soak for 3-5 minutes to assure maximum penetration. If a second application is needed, wait 24 hours before applying.
4. Buff dry any excess sealer that does not penetrate with a cloth or towel until surface is dry. Some highly porous surfaces may require a second application to give the material full protection. If a second application is needed, wait 24 hours before applying.

PROTECT: treated surface for at least 2 hours after application. Provide cross ventilation and fresh air for a minimum of 8 hours on interior applications.

PRECAUTIONS: This product contains combustible petroleum distillates. Keep away from heat and open flame. Avoid breathing fumes. Provide good cross ventilation and wear eye protection, gloves, and protective clothes. Read Material Safety Data Sheets for additional safety and health information.

CAUTIONS: Contains solvents. Harmful if swallowed. Keep out of reach of children. Always wear protective equipment. Read MSDS for more information.

RESTRICTIONS:

Take precautions to avoid contact with fumes, spray or splash to nearby masonry, property, pedestrians, and building occupants. Product contains petroleum distillates. Avoid breathing fumes, provide good cross ventilation. Keep away from open flames and sparks.

FIRST AID:

Eye Contact: Flush with water for 15 minutes and get medical attention.

Skin Contact: Wash with soap and water. If irritation persists, get medical attention.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air; provide oxygen if breathing is difficult. Call a physician

Ingestion: Call doctor immediately. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs, keep head below waist to prevent entry of liquid into lungs.
